Commercial, Noncommercial and Noncommercial Political Subdivision Applicator Agricultural Licensing

The Texas Department of Agriculture licenses pesticide applicators who use restricted-use and state-limited-use pesticides or regulated herbicides for the following purposes:

- aerial application
- agriculture
- aquatic pest control
- ornamental plant and turf production
- forestry
- right-of-way maintenance
- research
- regulatory pest control
- seed treatment, commodity fumigation
- education and research

Definitions

Commercial applicator: operates a business or is employed by a business that applies restricted-use or state-limited-use pesticides to property of another person for compensation.

Noncommercial applicator: must be licensed because he or she applies restricted-use or state-limited-use pesticides or regulated herbicides but does not qualify as a commercial applicator or private applicator.

Noncommercial Political Subdivision applicator: must be employed by a political subdivision of the state of Texas or of a federal agency operating in Texas.

Licensing Requirements

Applicants for a commercial applicator license must:

- 1. Pass the TDA general exam, laws and regulations exam and at least one category/subcategory exam other than aerial application or demonstration & research pest control;
- 2. Provide the required certification of financial responsibility;
- 3. Submit an application with a nonrefundable fee of \$180; and
- 4. Not have been convicted of a felony involving moral turpitude in the last five years.
- 5. Submit or have employer submit an Applicator Business Registration.

Applicants for a noncommercial applicator license must:

- 1. Pass the TDA general exam, laws and regulations exam and at least one category/subcategory exam other than aerial application or demonstration & research pest control; and
- 2. Submit application with \$120 fee.

Applicants for a noncommercial political subdivision applicator license must:

- 1. Pass the TDA general exam, laws and regulations exam and at least one category/subcategory exam other than aerial application or demonstration & research pest control; and
- 2. Submit application with \$12 fee.

Testing

TDA offices offer monthly testing. Applicants must be able to read and comprehend the subject matter; oral tests are not given. A passing grade is 70 or above.

There is no test fee for the general or laws and regulations exams. A \$24 fee is charged before testing for each category or subcategory exam. NCPS applicators are exempt from exam fees.

Application for License

After passing the general exam, laws and regulations exam and at least one category other than aerial application or demonstration & research pest control, the applicator must submit a license application with the appropriate license fee. In addition, commercial applicators must provide certification of financial responsibility in the amount of \$100,000 property damage and \$100,000 bodily injury per occurrence.

Expiration

A license expires anually on the anniversary of the date on which it was issued or renewed.

Recertification Requirements

Licensed commercial, noncommercial and NCPS applicators are required to recertify every year by obtaining five continuing education credits, with one credit each from two of the following categories: laws and regulations, integrated pest management or drift minimization.
